

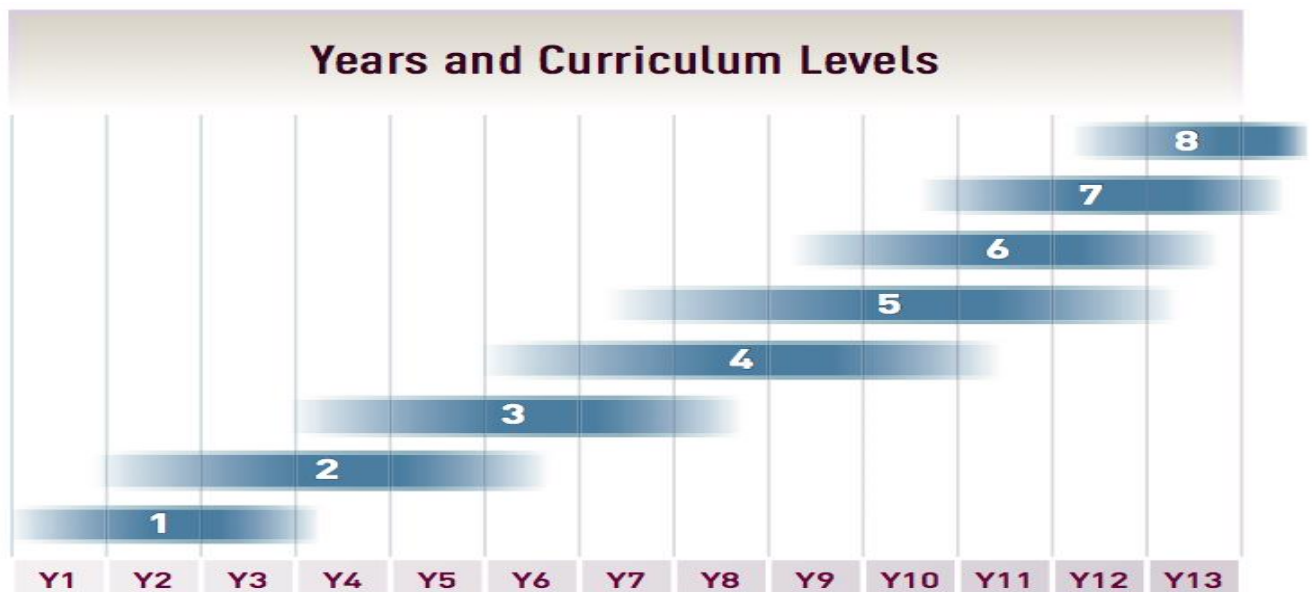
Parent Information on Assessment

Assessment information is posted on the KAMAR portal. If you need support with this please contact Assistant Principal Greg Thomson.

Reporting to parents occurs as follows:

- Fortnightly checks are uploaded to the portal every two weeks. These outline application and effort in classes. If your child is scoring a 2 we recommend contact with that class teacher.
- Academic Goal Setting by week 5 of Term 1
- An Interim Report around week 8 of Term 1. This gives an insight to progress and achievement from the first 5-6 weeks of the school year.
- Parent Report Evening around Week 4 of Term 2.
- Full reports for all students at the end of Term 2
- Reports on NCEA progress for Year 11-13 students at the end of Term 3
- Full reports for Year 7-10 students at the end of Term 4.

The information below is a guide to help interpret assessment information that may be in the KAMAR Portal. Please contact your child's class teacher or Whānau with any questions.



Clarification around B, P and A

By the end of Year 7-8 students are aiming to achieve level 4 of the curriculum. That is why you will see assessments with a number and then either B, P or A.

The number is the curriculum level e.g Level 3, Level 4 or Level 5.

The letters are:

B - Beginning of the level

P - Proficient in the level

A - Advanced in the level.

IKAN Mathematics Assessment

IKAN assesses your number knowledge. It assesses 4 areas.

Forward and Backward Number Sequence

Fractional Knowledge

Place Value

Basic Facts

Stage 4 is working at Year 4 for number knowledge for a particular area

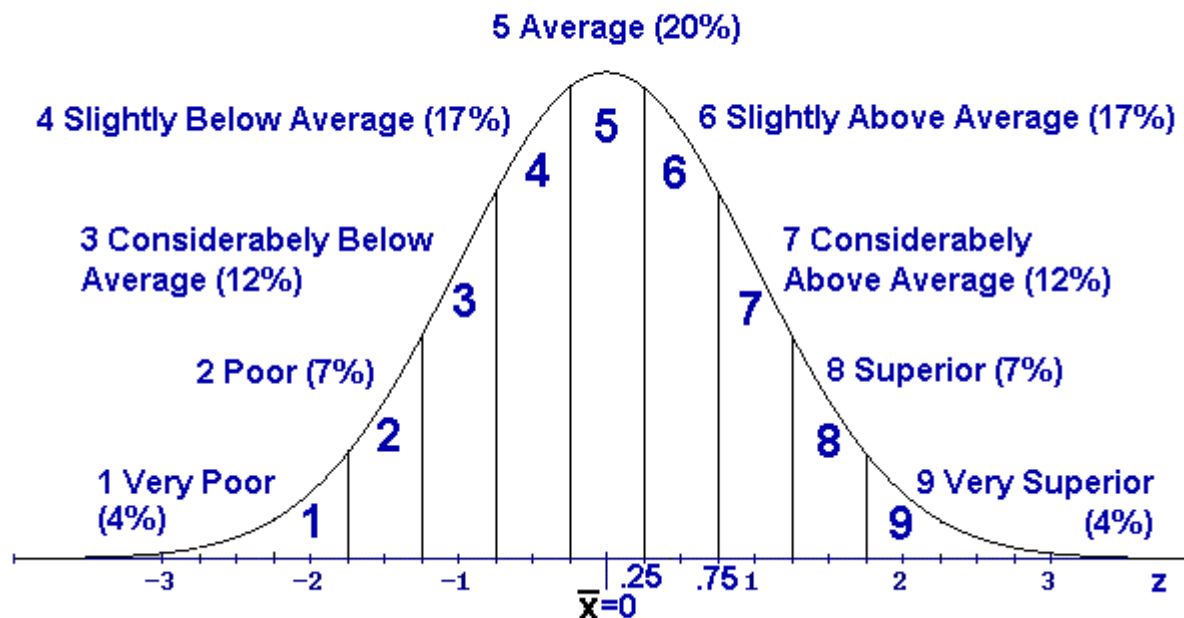
Stage 5 is working at Year 5 for number knowledge for a particular area

Stage 6 is working at Year 6 for number knowledge for a particular area

Stage 7 is working at Year 7 for number knowledge for a particular area

Stage 8 is working at Year 8 for number knowledge for a particular area

Stanines defined descriptively (with percent of scores):



PAT results are in Stanines. This shows how a student's scale score compares with a nationally representative sample of students in a year level. For example, you may be told that when compared with all Year 7 students nationally, your child is in stanine 7. Since the average stanine is stanine five, this indicates an above average performance.
